



Archaeologist Badge Requirements.

1. Have knowledge of one of the periods of human prehistory (for example Paleolithic, Neolithic, Mesolithic, Bronze Age, Iron Age) or the archaeology of Roman Cyprus.
2. Show an understanding of the importance of the reservation of ancient monuments, the necessity of reporting finds to the nearest museum, and the danger of digging without expert supervision.
3. Have general knowledge of the methods used by archaeologists for discovering and recognizing sites (for example field work, aerial photography and so on) and a knowledge of the process of scheduling of ancient monuments and any listed buildings in Cyprus

Complete any two of the following:

4. Produce a log with sketches and /or photographs of at least one weeks work on a 'dig' which you have assisted.
5. (a) Produce a log of a study of church architecture, including sketches made in the field of examples of seven different styles.
(b) Show that arts of a church can be approximately dated by architectural style.
6. Make a report on objects of two periods chosen from requirement 1 and exhibited in a museum.
7. Visit all the sites possible in an area to be decided upon by the examiner or curator of the museum. Report on the type and condition of each and draw a sketch map to scale of one of them

Notes:

- (i) The report must be illustrated with a sketch map of the area chosen, with the monuments marked on it.
 - (ii) The reporting to a museum of actual or threatened damage to an ancient monument is of great service and should always be done without delay.
8. Carry out an archaeological project chosen by you and approved by the examiner or a museum curator.
